Civil War Veteran

Funeral Held Here Sunday---Only One Civil War Veteran Still Living Here.

Another Civil War veteran, who spent most of the latter years of his life in Brownstown, answered the last roll call when George D. Carter passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Fred Robbins, in Columbus, Friday, February 10, 1933, at To'clock p. m. The cause of his death was cancer, from which he had been suffering for more than a year.

His death leaves Marion Hatton the only surviving Civil War veteran residing in Brownstown.

Mr. Carter was born in Washington county, April 21, 1846, the son of James and Ursula Carter, making his age at the time of his death 86 years, 9 months and 19 days. He was married twice. His first marriage was to Susan Cunningham at Mt. Eden, Washington county, July 16, 1871, who died August 31, 1905. To this union were born two sons and two daughters. His second marriage was to Elizabeth Albertson at Scottsburg, December 4, 1905, who died December 7, 1929.

Deceased came to this county and located in Brownstown thirty-four years ago. He was a farmer by occupation, but for a number of years he had lived a retired life. He was a member of the Brownstown Christian church and was a faithful attendant as long as his health permitted. He was a member of Company E 43rd Indiana Infantry Volunteers, and the G. A. R. He enlisted at the age of 18, and was honorably discharged June 14, 1865, at Indianapolis. After his discharge he followed the occupation of carpentering and farming.

He is survived by three children, by
