Clark—Noble Clark, one of Brownstown's most highly esteemed citizens passed away at his home at this place Saturday morning at 8:20 o'clock following a long illness of a complication of diseases. Although his illness was of long duration, he was kind and considerate with everyone and never complained.

Noble C. Clark, son of David and Mary Pruden Clark, both deceased, was born in Brownstown, where he spent his entire life, November 22, 1878, and died December 27, 1930, aged 52 years, 1 month and 5 days.

On October 22, 1905, he was married to Miss Daisy Pfenning, who with one son, Dr. Roy Clark, of Brownstown, and one grandson, Joseph Robert Clark, survives him. He also leaves three brothers and two sisters, Worth Clark and Mrs. Nettie Wayman, of Brownstown; Charles Clark, of Brookfield, Missouri; Hugh Clark, of Ottumwa, Iowa, and Mrs. Dawn Thompson, of Cortland.

Mr. Clark attended the Brownstown schools and was graduated with the class of 1898. He was a devoted member of the Presbyterian church and as long as his health permitted he attended the services. He was a deacon in the church and served as church treasurer for almost twelve years and was reluctant to give it up on account of his health. He was also a member of Brownstown Lodge Number 60, Knights of Pythias.

He was true to every trust and the old saying "his word was as good as his bond," was applicable in its strictest sense to him. He has set a high mark for honesty and integrity for others to follow. To know him was to admire him, for his pleasing ways won him many friends. He entered the Postal Railway Service twenty-six years ago and proved himself a favorite among his fellow employees. On account of ill health he was forced to retire from the service two years ago.

Funeral services were conducted by the Rev. Roy Brumbaugh at the Presbyterian church Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Burial in Fairview cemetery.
