Worth L. Clark Dies In Florida

Worth L. Clark, 75, of Lake Worth, Fla., died about 5 p. m. Monday in a hospital in that city. He had been in ill health for the past 15 years.

A native of Brownstown and a former trustee of Brownstown township for two terms, Mr. Clark also lived in Seymour for a short time, operating a Sinclair bulk oil station here. He and his father operated a grocery store in Brownstown from 1908 to 1920 and Mr. Clark later operated a Thompson Dairy Company route in Brownstown. He also resided in Dayton, O., before moving to Florida.

Mr. Clark was born Feb. 22, 1885, in Brownstown, the son of the late David A. and Mary Ellen Pruden Clark. He was married first to the former Grace Weddell, of Brownstown, who preceded him in death, and then to the former Mary Berry, of Houston, who survives. He was a member of Brownstown Methodist Church, Washington Lodge No. 13, Free and Accepted Masons, Brownstown, and Knights of Pythias Lodge No. 60, Brownstown.

Surviving in addition to his widow are three children, C. Robert Clark, Fort Lauderdale, Fla., Mrs. Ruth Newkirk, Lake Worth, Fla., and Mrs. W. Leon Gardner, Seattle, Wash.; one brother, Hugh B. Clark, Ottumwa, Iowa; one sister, Mrs. Holmes A. Thompson, Cortland; and nine grandchildren. One child, two brothers and one sister preceded him in death.

Funeral services will be conducted at 3 p. m. Saturday from Winklepleck Funeral Home, Brownstown, with the Rev. Emmett Jones, pastor of the Brownstown Methodist Church, officiating. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.
