Death Summons County Woman

Mrs. Mary F. Cockerham, age eighty-four, a life-long resident of the Brownstown vicinity, died at 3 o'clock this morning at the home of her daughter, Miss Cora Lewis, in Freetown. She had been in failing health for some time with complications incident to her advanced age.

Mrs. Cockerham was born near Brownstown on February 27, 1855, the daughter of Jesse and Mandy Hicks Lucas. She was married in 1876 to James Lewis. They were the parents of one daughter, who survives. Mr. Lewis died in 1924, and she later was married to Rueben Cockerham. For the past twenty-one years, she had lived at her daughter's home. She was the last survivor in a family of seven children.

Mrs. Cockerham had been a member of the Pleasant Grove Methodist Church for the past fifty years and was active in its affairs as long as her health permitted. A host of friends throughout western Jackson county mourn her death.

Funeral services will be conducted at 1 o'clock Sunday afternoon from the Wallace Funeral Home at Brownstown with the Rev. Clyde S. Black, pastor of the Brownstown Methodist Church, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery.
