

DEATH OF WELL KNOWN PHYSICIAN

Dr. D. J. Cummings Expires Tuesday Morning at His Home in Medora

PROMINENT IN PUBLIC AFFAIRS

Vetern of the Civil War -- List of Other Deaths Not Mentioned by Our Correspondents.

Dr. David J. Cummings, one of Jackson county's most well-known physicians, died at his home in Medera, Tuesday morning, May 22, 1917, aged 71 years, 10 months and 10 days. His death followed a stroke of appoplexy, from which he suffered an attack about two months ago, but he had been in declining health for several years past.

Deceased was one of the county's most prominent citizens, who not only ranked high in the medical profession, but who took an active part in religious, political and public affairs in general. He was especially



well-known to The Banner readers, having been one of the oldest and most efficient correspondents of this paper, contributing regularly to its columns, first from Houston, where he lived for many years, and later from Medora, from which place he reported regularly until his last illness.

The Banner editor and our able corps of correspondents, including many who have since ceased to write for this paper, especially appreciate the efforts he periorch as one of our most able and regular contributors.

The funeral services were held at the Christian church in Medera today at one o'clock, Rev. Brock, of Borden officiating, after which the remains were brought to Brownstown, where brief services were conducted at the Christian church at 2.45 p. m., followed by interment in Fairview connectory, under the auspices of the Masonic Order.

Dr. David J. Cummings, eldest of six children born to Joseph and Malinda Faubien Cummings, was born near Zelma, Lawrence county, Indiana July 11, 1845, on the farm where his father had resided for 54 years and who was the oldest native born citizen of Lawrence county.
