B'town Barber Expires

Funeral services for Charles Lee DeLong, 68, of 709 South Main street, Brownstown, were conducted this afternoon from the Winklepleck Funeral Home with the Rev. Evan Bolejack, pastor of the Brownstown Christian Church, officiating. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery.

Mr. DeLong died at 5 p. m. Saturday in Methodist Evangelical Hospital, Louisville, after an illness of eight weeks.

A lifelong resident of the county, Mr. DeLong had been a barber for over 30 years and was a part owner of the DeLong-Hackman Barber Shop in Brownstown.

A member of the Brownstown Christian Church, he had served in the Navy during World War I. He was a member of Eastern Star, Chapter No. 264, Washington Lodge No. 13, Free and Accepted Masons, and the Camp Jackson Post No. 112, American Legion, all of Brownstown.

Born June 22, 1899, in Free-town, he was the son of the late Albert and Agnes Myers DeLong.

On June 12, 1932, in Seymour, he married the former Margaret E. Spurgeon, who survives.

Other survivors are a son, Richard H. DeLong, of Seymour; three brothers, James DeLong, of Muncie, Bruce DeLong, of Milton, Pa., Guy DeLong, of Indianapolis, and two grandchildren.

Two brothers and two sisters preceded him in death.
