Charles E. Denny Found Dead At Home

Funeral rites will be at 1:30 o'clock Thursday afternoon from the Spurgeon Funeral Home, here, for Charles E. Denny, well-known Kurtz resident.

Mr. Denny, a retired railroad foreman, who was 78 years old, was found dead, sitting in a chair in his living room, Monday morning. Death is believed to have occurred sometime the preceding evening.

A native of Freetown, he was born October 6, 1880, a son of the late Adam and Jane Spurgeon Denny. He was married on November 16, 1901, at Freetown, to Tessa Braden, who died in 1946.

For many years Mr. Denny was a foreman with the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railroad. He was a member of the Freetown Methodist Church, Clearspring Lodge No. 323, Free and Accepted Masons, the Kurtz Chapter, Order of Eastern Star, and the Modern Woodman Lodge at Freetown.

Surviving are a son, Edward Denny, a resident of Columbus, three grandchildren, three great-grandchildren; three brothers, Merion Denny and Frank Denny, of Freetown, and Theodore Denny, New Castle and a sister, Mrs. Alice Bebout, Freetown.
