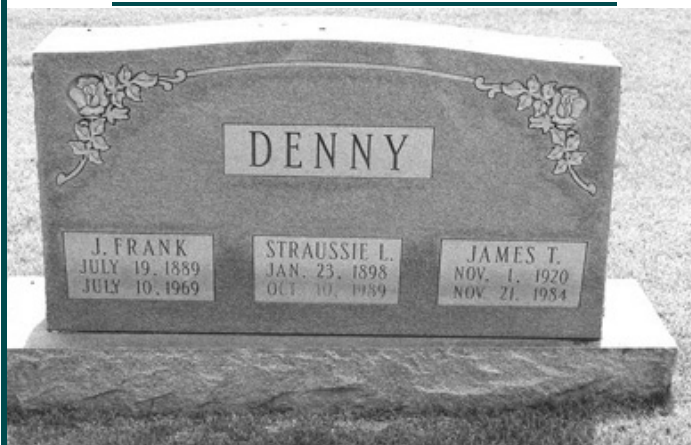

Found Dead At

Freetown Home

Frank Denny, 79, Freetown, was found dead at his home Thursday. Keith Burkholder, Jackson County coroner, ruled the death due to a self-inflicted gunshot wound from a .22 caliber rifle. Burkholder set the time of death at approximately 2:30 p. m. Mr. Denny was found by his wife.

Mr. Denny was a member of the Freetown, United Methodist Church and Seymour American Legion Post No. 89 and a World War I veteran. He had lived in the county all his life and was a retired employe of the Standard Oil Co.

He was born July 19, 1889, in Freetown, the son of the late Adam and Jane Spurgeon Denny.

On May 4, 1918, in Kurtz, he married the former Straussie Fleetwood, who survives. Other survivors include two sons, James T. Denny, Freetown, and William A. Denny, Lyons; a daughter, Mrs. Harry (June) Spurgeon, Brownstown R1; two brothers, James Merton Denny, Freetown, and Theodore Denny, New Castle; a sister, Mrs. Alice Bebout, Freetown; six grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p. m. Sunday from the Spurgeon Funeral Home, Brownstown, with the Rev. Dallas J. Collier, pastor of the Freetown United Methodist Church, officiating. Burial in Fairview Cemetery at Brownstown.
