DEATH RECORD.

Dodds—Many friends were grieved when the message was received Monday that Mrs. Newton Dodds had passed away at the Methodist hospital in Indianapolis at 8 o'clock a. m. following a surgical operation that she underwent last Thursday for gallstones.

Mrs. Dodds had undergone an operation in June at the same hospital and in a few weeks was able to return home. She seemed to be getting along nicely until about two weeks before the operation last Thursday, when she was taken ill and returned to the hospital a week ago Sunday.

Mr. Dodds, who had been at her bedside, came home Sunday night to tell the members of the family of her serious condition and returned to Indianapolis Monday morning to be with her, but she passed away before he reached the hospital.

Christena B. Mitchell was born at Clearspring in 1866 and was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Mitchell. For several years she taught school in Jackson county. September 4, 1887, she was united in marriage to Newton Dodds and to their union were born four children. About ten years ago they moved from Medora to Ewing, where they have since operated the Dodds hotel.

Being of a pleasant disposition she was quick to make friends of those with whom she came in contact and had a wide circle of friends, who will learn of her passing away with sincere regret. She was a good wife, devoted mother and an obliging neighbor. In early life she united with the Christian church.

Besides her husband she leaves two daughters, Miss Ruby and Mrs. Blanche Sheets, who reside at home; two sons, Norman, of North Vernon, and Ralph, of Indianapolis; one stepson, Harry Dodds, of Medora, and four grandchildren. She also leaves her mother, Mrs. Wm. Mitchell of Clearspring, two sisters, Mrs. Mattie Bray, of Mooresville, Ind., Mrs. Margaret Chapman, of Chalk Buttes, Mont., and five brothers, George, Fred and Charles Mitchell, of Clearspring; John Mitchell, of Kokomo, and Frank Mitchell, of Bedford.

Funeral services were conducted at the residence this afternoon at 2 o'clock the Rev. C. V. Weddell, pastor of the Medora Christian church officiating. Burial in Fairview cemetery.
