Burial Rites Held At Fairview Cemetery For Everett Dougherty

Burial rites were held in Fairview Cemetery, here, last Wednesday afternoon, following funeral services in Indianapolis for Everett Leon Dougherty, in Indianapolis.

Mr. Dougherty died from a heart attack at his home, 823 South Lynhurst, Indianapolis, while removing straw from tulip bulbs in his yard.

Born in Seymour, Mr. Dougherty was a son of Edgar Dougherty, a Brownstown painter and a grandson of Alex Dougherty, for many years owner of a blacksmith shop here.

Mr. Dougherty had lived in Indianapolis for 38 years. The last

11 years he had been a relief driver for the Indianapolis Transit System, with his runs scheduled primarily in the Butler University area. However, he made runs all over the city and maintained a high safety record.

Previously he worked for the Fertig Ice Cream Company, where he was in charge of making ice cream.

During World War II he was stationed in a civilian capacity at Wright Patterson Air Force Base, Dayton, Ohio.

Mr. Dougherty was keenly interested in bowling and played on the Transit System team. He was a member of the Otterbein Evangelical United Brethren Church, but attended Lynhurst Baptist Church, Indianapolis, and was a Mason and a member of the Indianapolis Valley of Scottish Rite.
