Funeral Rites Held For George E. Douglass

Funeral services for George E. Douglass, age fifty, of Brownstown, were conducted this afternoon from the home of his brother, Frank Douglass, in Brownstown, at whose home he died late Saturday night, following an illness of four months' duration. The

Rev. J. L. Jackson, pastor of the Brownstown Baptist Church, was in charge, with burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

Mr. Douglass had been employed through the Civil Service Commission at the Navy Yards, Mare Island, Dalalego, Calif., since June 9, 1943, until he suffered an injury on March 27 of this year necessitating his removal to Brownstown on July 6.

A life-long resident of this county save for his employment in California, Mr. Douglass was born in Brownstown on October 19, 1893, the son of Stephen and Nettie Douglass, both of whom preceded him in death. He was unmarried.

Mr. Douglass was a painter and paper-hanger by trade, and was well-known throughout the county, where he leaves a host of friends who mourn his death. He was a member of Camp Jackson Post 112 of the American Legion, in Brownstown.

Enlisting in the armed forces during World War I on March 29, 1918, as an electrician at Camp Taylor, Mr. Douglass served nine months overseas, receiving an honorable discharge on July 23, 1919.

Survivors include the brother, Frank Douglass; one sister, Mrs. Harry McOsker, of Brownstown, and a nephew, Pat McOsker, who is serving with the Army Air Forces at San Diego, Calif.
