Dies Of Heart Trouble Here Saturday

John Durment, Age 34, Popular
Young Brownstown Man, Passes
Away At His Home Here.

Many friends were shocked and grieved Saturday afternoon when the report became known that John Durment, 34, had passed away at his home in Brownstown at 4 o'clock, following an illness of only four hours. Death was due to heart trouble.

For a number of years he has been employed as an automobile salesman for the Boss Motor Company and because of the nature of his occupation he came in contact with many people in Jackson and adjoining counties.

"Tige," as he was so familiarly known, was perhaps one of the most popular young men in the community. By means of his jovial disposition he readily made and kept friends in all walks of life.

He was a member of the Methodist church, the Masonic lodge and the Knights of Pythias. He was a past commander and past adjutant of Camp Jackson Post 112, The Ameri-

can Legion, Brownstown, and also an active member of Voiture 145, Forty and Eight, Indianapolis.

John Hudson Durment was born in Brownstown October 11, 1898, the son of John D. and Emma Hudson Durment and spent his entire life here. He attended the Brownstown schools and was graduated with the class of 1917. On December 31, 1921, he was married in Brownstown to Miss Bess E. Deputy, who survives.

Besides the widow he leaves one daughter, Elizabeth Ann, age ten, at home; his mother, Mrs. Emma Durment, of Brownstown, and two sisters, Mrs. Blanche Houston, of Franklin, and Mrs. Ruth Wheeler, of Indianapolis.
