

Glenn R. Empson, Brownstown, Dies

Glenn R. Empson, a prominent resident of Brownstown, died at his home there shortly before noon Friday after an illness of five months.

Mr. Empson, who was 56 years old, had been in failing health for the past four years and had gradually given up his many activities in Brownstown.

He served for many years as clerk of the Christian Church, as a vice-president of the Jackson County Chapter of the American Red Cross during the war and as treasurer of the Brownstown Masonic lodge.

As a rural mail carrier at the Brownstown post office for almost a quarter century, he was well known to hundreds of persons in this vicinity who mourn the passing of a friend.

He was also a member of the Order of Eastern Star and of Camp Jackson Post of the American Legion, Brownstown. He was active in Legion circles in Brownstown and throughout the county.

A native of Vallonia, Mr. Empson was born on February 23, 1891, the son of William and Mary Jane (Copeland) Empson. He lived in Jackson county all his life,
