

## List of Deaths not Mentioned by Correspondents.

ENDEBROCK—William H. Endebrock, whose death was briefly mentioned last week, was born on a farm in Grassy Fork township, this county May 14, 1864; died at his home in Brownstown, Wednesday, March 15, 1911, after several week's illness, aged 46 years, 10 months and one day. He was the oldest son of Henry and Susan (DeWyk) Endebrock, his father having preceded him to the grave in July, 1900.

After completing the common branches in the district schools of his township, Mr. Endebrock continued his studies in the Tampico graded schools and in 1884 entered the Indiana State University at Bloomington, where he pursued a regular college course for two years. He then returned to Jacksom county taking up the profession of teaching, which he followed successfully for eight years.

After teaching a few years the desire to become a lawyer came upon him andduring the summer months, between school terms, he studied law in the office of Marshall & Munden in Seymour, and in 1889 was admitted to the Jackson County bar. The following year he opened a law office in Brownstown and in a short time became recognized as one of the leading and successful attorneys in Jackson county. He soon built up an excellent practice, especially among the Germans, and was identified with some of the most important cases that came up for trial in the Jackson Circuit Court.

On June 20th, 1895, Mr. Endebrock was united in marriage to Miss Hannah Sunderman, at the bride's home in Page County, Iowa, after which they came to Brownstown, where they have since made their home. To their union were born two daughters—Clara, who died about five years ago, and Louie, who with her mother, survives him. He is also survived by his aged mother, one brother and one sister; Albert and Miss Lou Endebrock, all of this place.

Deceased is well known all over the county and had a large circle of friends, who deeply sympathize with the bereaved relatives.

Funeral services were held at the Presbyterian church Sunday morning at 10:30 o'clock, Rev. L. V. Rule officiating, after which the remains were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
