

Funeral rites were held Monday afternoon from the Brownstown Church of the Nazarene for a former pastor, the Rev. William R. Fields, pastor of the First Church of the Nazarene at Montezuma. The Rev. Mr. Fields died Christ-

The Kev. Mr. Fields died Christ-mas morning in a hospital at Clinton where he had been in a semi-conscious condition since his admittance on Thursday, Decem-ber 17, following a stroke of par-alysis. In the past months he had suffered several heart at-tacks tacks.

tacks. The Rev. Mr. Fields, who was 63 years of age, was born on Jan-uary 28, 1896, at Greenfield, the son of the late William and Min-nie Fields. His father died before he was born. He grew up in Greenfield and, as a young man, enrolled in Olivet Nazarene Bible College, then at Olivet, Illinois. He entered the Nazarene minis-try twenty-eight years ago, with

He entered the Nazarene minis-try twenty-eight years ago, with his first charge at Worthington. During the years he served Naz-arene congregations at Oakland City, St. Bernice, Beech Grove, Oden, coming to Brownstown in the Fall of 1948 to minister to the Brownstown church. He left here in 1954 to accept a

call to become pastor of the Church of the Nazarene at Win-slow, where he remained for two years, going from there to Evans-ville, and was beginning his sec-ond year's pastorate at Montezuma

zuma. The Rev. Mr. Fields was devot-ed to his calling and during his five-year ministry here the Brownstown Church grew in membership and strength. A man of kindly manner, sin-cere and friendly, he made many friends both in Brownstown and throughout the entire county a he wherever he was needed.

Introductor his task of ministering where about his task of ministering wherever he was næeded. He was married in Greenfield, on August 13, 1932, to Alice Edna McCall, of Missouri, who was a college classmate åt Olivet. Mrs. Fields survives as do two daughters. Mrs. Jack (Wilma Ruth) Callahan, of Brownstown, and Mrs. Robert (Rosemary) Charles, of Columbus. Also surviving are four grand-children, one of whom. little two-weeks'-old Diana Jean Callahan, the Rev. Mr. Fields never saw, and two sisters. Mrs. Jessie Moore and Mrs. Claude Cook, both living in Greenfield.
