

FINDLEY-Mrs. Nancy E. Findley, daughter of Oscar and Zulima Lawell, deceased, was born about two miles northeast of Brownstown, May 18, 1842, and died at her home, three-fourths of a mile north of Cortland, February 27, 1911, aged 68 years, 5 months and 9 days.

Deceased had been in poor health for about a year and a half. She was first taken sick with pneumonia, but the immediate cause of her death was a tumor.

She was united in marriage to Nicholas M. Findley in January, 1863. For about two years they resided northeast of Brownstown and then moved to Hamilton township, where she has since resided in the same house she went to housekeeping. Her husband preceded her to the grave about nine years ago. For a number of years she has been blind. She united with the Methodist church at Brownstown when a child and remained a member until leath. Her christian life was beautifu' from its beginning to its close, and through all the vicissitudes and sorrows that he met in the way, her faith in God never wavered. She was a kind and loving mother and her devotion to her family had no limit.

She is vurvived by three sons, viz: Bruce and 'Hugh, of Hamilton township, and Walter, of Edna, 'Texas. She also leaves one brother, John Lawell, of Cortland. Her death will not only be mourned by her children and relatives, but by all who knew her as she was a kind neighbor and a good friend.

The remains were brought to Brownstown Wednesday morning, where the funeral services were conducted at the M. E. church at ten o'clock, Rev. Edw. F. Schneider officiating, after which the remains were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
