Pedestrian Killed On U.S.Rd.50

Hada Fleenor, 43, Of Lehigh Killed Instantly When Hit By Automobile.

Father Of 7 Children

Accident West Of Seymour---Skull Fractured, Neck And Both Legs Broken.

Hada Ora Fleenor, aged 43, an employe of the Lehigh Portland Cement Company, was killed instantly about one o'clock Sunday morning when struck by an automobile on U. S. Road No. 50 west of Seymour. The accident occurred near the road leading from Road 50 to the airport about a mile west of Seymour.

Mr. Fleenor was struck by a car driven by Maurice Schneck, aged twenty, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Schneck, residing near Seymour, The front part of his skull was crushed, and his neck and both legs were broken.

Deputy Coroner S. F. Tower conducted an inquest and rendered a verdict of accidental death. According to evidence at the inquest Fleenor was walking almost in the center of the road when struck by the Schneck car, while passing another car approaching from an opposite

Mr. Schweck testified that he did not see Eleenor until he was less than twenty-five feei in front of him. He said he was driving about forty-five miles an hour. He applied the brackes as soon as he sew the man, but the car did not stop in time from avoiding him.
