Pedestrian Killed On U.S.Rd.50

Hada Fleenor, 43, Of Lehigh
Killed Instantly When Hit
By Automobile.

Father Of 7 Children

**Accident West Of Seymour--
Skull Fractured, Neck And
Both Legs Broken.**

Hada Ora Fleenor, aged 43, an
employee of the Lehigh Portland Ce-
ment Company, was killed instantly
about one o'clock Sunday morning
when struck by an automobile on
U. S. Road No. 50 west of Seymour.

The accident occurred near the
road leading from Road 50 to the
airport about a mile west of Seymour.

Mr. Fleenor was struck by a car
driven by Maurice Schneck, aged
twenty, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles
Schneck, residing near Seymour.
The front part of his skull was
crushed, and his neck and both legs
were broken.

Deputy Coroner S. F. Tower con-
ducted an inquest and rendered a
verdict of accidental death. Accord-
ing to evidence at the inquest Flee-
nor was walking almost in the center
of the road when struck by the
Schneck car, while passing another
car approaching from an opposite
direction.

Mr. Schneck testified that he did
not see Fleenor until he was less
than twenty-five feet in front of
him. He said he was driving about
fifty-five miles an hour. He applied
the brakes as soon as he saw the man,
but the car did not stop in time
from avoiding him.

Virgil Lunte, driver of the other
car, said that he saw Fleenor walk-
ing about the center of the road.
Mr. Lunte was accompanied by Mrs.
Lunte and Mr. and Mrs. Gilbert
Sutton. Riding with Mr. Schneck
were Miss Violet Bode, Miss Faye
Spray, Woodrow Lahne and Miss
Martha Schneck.

Mr. Fleenor was born in Washing-
ton county June 22, 1896, son of
Emory and Louis Fleenor. He was
married to Miss Orpha Killion Sep-
tember 2, 1918. To their union were
born eight children, four boys and
four girls, of whom seven—three boys
and four girls—together with their
mother survive, viz: Marion, Ora,
Robert, Fern, Mary, Lorene and Lo-
retta. He is also survived by three
sisters, Mrs. Gladys Williams and Mrs.
Myrtle Rice, of Vallonia, and Mrs.
Hazel Hamilton, of Campbellsburg.

Funeral services, conducted by the
Rev. A. A. Cohn, pastor of the First
Baptist church in Seymour, were held
in the Brownstown Baptist church
Tuesday afternoon at two o'clock.
Interment in Fairview cemetery.
