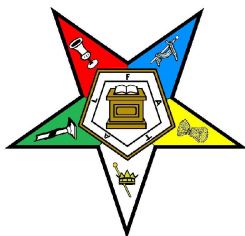

## Mrs. Ida Fleming Dies—Former License Branch Manager Here

Funeral rites were held Monday afternoon from the Zabel Funeral Home for Mrs. Ida Eastin Fleming, 66, well-known Brownstown resident, who was in the restaurant business here for a number of years and also manager of the Brownstown Automobile License Branch for several years.

In failing health for many years, Mrs. Fleming died about 4:00 o'clock Saturday morning in the Jackson County Hospital where this last time she had been a patient since March 1.

Born in Brownstown, July 3, 1901, she was the daughter of the late William L. and Ina Z. Richardson Eastin. She attended Brownstown High School, and in 1953, at Crown Point, was married to Calvin L. Fleming, who is deceased.

She was a member of Brownstown Christian Church and of Brownstown Chapter No. 264, Order of Eastern Star.

Mrs. Fleming opened "Ida's Place" on Commerce Street, later known as "Bill's Place" which she operated for several years and also operated a restaurant in Ewing.

Active in Democratic politics for many years, she served as vice-chairman of the Jackson County, Democratic Central Committee and also was a member of the Auxiliary to Camp Jackson Post No. 112, American Legion of Brownstown.

During the years she operated the Brownstown Automobile License Branch she became widely known and made many warm friends throughout the entire area.

Surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Nolan Smith, Brownstown R1, and Mrs. William D. McAfee, of Hobart, a former member of the Brownstown High School faculty.

She also leaves five nieces and nephews.

Mike Bell, pastor of the Ratcliff Grove Christian Church, was in charge of the funeral rites and burial was in Fairview Cemetery, in Brownstown.
