Funeral Rites Monday For Accident Victim

Arthur A. Flick Dies In Hospital Thursday Of Injuries Suffered When Car Rams Utility Pole On U.S. 50

Funeral rites were held Monday morning from the Voss Chapel for Arthur A. Flick, 712 North Walnut Street, Seymour.

Mr. Flick died at 5:30 o'clock Thursday afternoon in the Jackson Count, Schneck Memorial Hospital of injuries suffered on Wednesday when the car he was driving rammed a utility pole on U. S. 50 at the intersection of the Freeman Field Road.

Mr. Flick's condition was termed "critical" at the time of his admittance to the hospital.

He was driving north on the Freeman Field Road and, was unable to stop as he entered U, S. 50 and his car went into a skid and sheered off a Public Service Indiana utility pole.

Power was cut off to industries at Freeman Field and customers on the south of U. S. 50 for several hours.

Mr. Flick, who was a night watchman at the John C. Groub Company, was 56 years of age. He was born in Jackson County on October 11, 1911, a son of the late William R. and Elizabeth Van Dewalle Flick. On March 9, 1938, he was married, in Brownstown, to Bessie L. Cockerham, who died on October 24, 1960.
