Cecil Clair "Goog" Forgey, 81, a retired Freetown merchant, died at 8:30 a.m. Thursday, June 12, at his home in Cortland.

A lifelong local resident, he was a member of the Freetown United Methodist Church and formerly sold poultry and dairy products in Freetown. He was a member of the Modern Woodmen of America.
