Cline W. Forgey, 66, Ex-County Official Dies Friday Morning

Funeral services were conducted at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon from the Brownstown Christian Church, in charge of the Rev. John U. Phelps, pastor, and the Rev. George Sommers, for Cline W. Forgey, well-known Brownstown resident, who died at his home here Thursday night.

Burial services were held at Fairview Cemetery with Washington Lodge No. 13, Free and Accepted Masons, of Brownstown, conducting the Masonic burial ritual.

Mr. Forgey served as Jackson county attendance officer for fifteen years, with his office located in the Jackson county superintendent of school's office at the county courthouse. For more than nineteen years he was a school teacher, serving on the teaching staffs in Brownstown township, in Pershing and Salt Creek townships and also in Washington county.

He was a member of the Brownstown Christian Church, serving this congregation in official capacities, and at the time of his death was an elder. He took an active part in all phases of church work and in religious groups affiliated with the Christian congregation. He was a past master of Washington Lodge No. 13, Free and Accepted Masons, of Brownstown, and for many years was active in the work of this Order.

Mr. Forgey also was active for a number of years in the work of the Jackson County Chapter, American Red Cross, and was deeply interested in the growth and betterment of the community.

A son of the late Leander and Agnes Braden Forgey, Mr. Forgey was born December 6, 1885, south of Freetown. He was married April 27, 1910, at Brownstown to Ethel Martin, who survives. He and his family moved to Brownstown, from Freetown, for residence in 1925.

Besides the widow he is survived by a son, Homer Forgey, of Gary, two daughters, Mrs. William M. Conner, Sunset Parkway, Jackson township; and Mrs. John Adolph, of Indianapolis; three brothers, Clyde Forgey, of Bicknell; James Forgey, of Brownstown and William Forgey, of Freetown and four sisters, Mrs. R. G. Hudson, Seymour; Mrs. Glen Denny, Franklin; Mrs. Ray Berry and Mrs. Lloyd Spurgeon, Freetown. He also has four grandchildren, William and Jonathan Forgey, of Gary, and James and Nina Jean Adolph, of Indianapolis.

One sister and two brothers preceded him in death.
