Walter Fountain Funeral Friday

Walter L. Fountain, 74, well-known cattle breeder and farmer, died suddenly late Wednesday morning at his farm where he lived on Freetown R1 three miles west of Brownstown. He had suffered a slight heart attack a month ago, but the fatal attack Wednesday came unexpectedly.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon from the Winklepleck Funeral Home in Brownstown with the Rev. Harold Barnett, a Christian minister residing in Seymour, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

Mr. Fountain was born July 27, 1881, at Heltonville, the son of the late Andrew S. and Mary Mitchell Fountain. He lived west of Brownstown most of his life and was married April 8, 1903, in Brownstown to Josephine Applewhite, who survives. He was widely known through the state as a breeder of registered Polled Hereford cattle, which won prizes when exhibited at many shows. He was an active member of the Ratcliff Grove Christian Church and enjoyed the acquaintance and esteem of a host of friends who mourn his death.

Besides the widow, he is survived by two sons: Dr. Thomas Fountain, of Medora and Henry A. Fountain, associated with his father on the farm west of Brownstown; a brother, Frank Fountain, of Logansport, and a sister, Mrs. Emma Lynn Campbell, of Chicago. Two grandchildren, Jack Fountain, west of Brownstown and Rosemary Fountain, of Medora, also survive.
