George Franklin, Brownstown, Dies

Ex-County Highway Department Clerk Expires at Age of 91

George D. Franklin, Brownstown, clerk of the Jackson county highway department until a few weeks ago, when illness prevented him from retaining the office, died this morning at Schneck Memorial Hospital at the age of 91.
