Illness of Two Years Fatal to Aged Resident of Brownstown.

Peter Heller, age eighty-two, one of the oldest residents of Brownstown, died at 6 o'clock this morning at the home in Brownstown. He had been ill for two years since suffering a stroke and his condition had been serious for a short time.

Funeral services will be conducted Thursday afternoon from the Brownstown Presbyterian Church. Burial in Fairview Cemetery.

Mr. Heller, a prominent resident of the county seat, was born on September 14, 1856, on the farm which is now the site of the Jackson county state forest southeast of Brownstown. He was the son of the late Adam, Sr., and Wilhelmina Schwein Heller. He was married about fifty-five vears ago to Nora Young, who survives.

Mr. Heller was a member of the Brownstown Presbyterian Church, and of the Knights of Pythias lodge at Brownstown. A host of friends and relatives, including a number in Seymour, were shocked to learn of his death.

A daughter, Mrs. May Wittenburg, died during the influenza epidemic of 1917-18. Besides the widow, he is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Elizabeth Robbins, of Brownstown, two grandchildren and one great grandchild. Two brothers, Frank Heller, of Los Angeles, Calif., and Louis Heller, of Terre Haute, who is ninety-two years of age, also survives.
