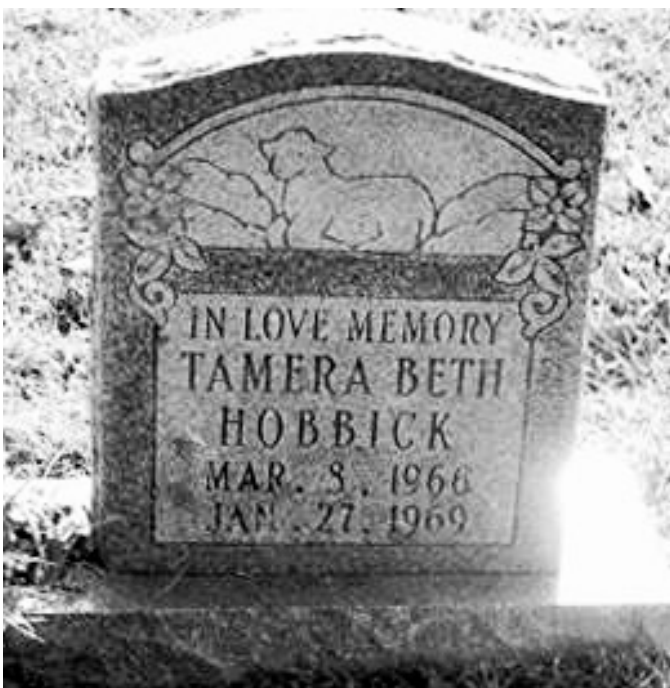

## Death Of Little Reddington Girl Ruled Accidental

Coroner Says Two-Year-Old Tamera Beth Hobbicks Dies From Broken Blood Vessel.

Dr. Kenneth Schneider, Bartholomew County coroner, has ruled that death of little two-year-old Tamera Beth Hobbick, of Reddington, was an accident.

The little girl died last Monday in Bartholomew County Hospital, Columbus, from a head injury suffered in a fall at her home.

The little girl, who would have been three years old on March 8, lived with her father and step-mother, Mr. and Mrs. Lester Hobbick, Seymour R1.

Dr. Schneider explained that death was due to a broken blood vessel on the outermost underneath covering of the brain caused by a trauma.

He said that the Hobbicks told him they heard the child fall while she was on the way to the bathroom but did not see if she had struck her head.

Funeral rites for the little girl were held last Wednesday from the Johnson Funeral Home, Vallonia. Burial was in Rest Haven Cemetery, Edinburg.

Surviving with the father and stepmother are the mother, Mrs. Marilyn Hobbick, Edinburg; a sister, Deidra Anne Hobbick, living with the father; two step-sisters, Lana and Traesia Bowling, and a step-brother, Kelvin Bowling, all at home; the maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Jack French, of Edinburg, and the paternal grandmother, Mrs. Walter Fulford, also of Edinburg.
