

In 1970, he founded Brownstown Electric with long-time partner, Carl Shake. He owned and operated L. C. Farms. In 2003, he was named Honorary Member of the American Salers Association. He was a long-time member of the American Hereford and the Association American Saler Association. He was the first president of the Indiana Saler Association. He belonged to the Indiana Cattleman Association, receiving the lifetime service award in 2003. He was a long-time supporter of FFA. where he was an honorary member. In 1999, he was recognized by the Jackson County Fair and the Jackson County Beef Cattleman's Association for his dedication and contributions to the Jackson County Fair. He was an avid fan of the Indianapolis Colts and the St. Louis Cardinals. He was a longtime supporter and sponsor of youth leagues in the area.
