## Funeral Rites For Mrs. Lizzie Holeman Set For Friday

Funeral rites for Mrs. Lizzie Marie Holeman have been set for 2:30 o'clock Friday afternoon at the Winklepleck Funeral Home.

Mrs. Holeman, grandmother of Mrs. George Okes, a member of The Bannef staff, died shortly after noon Tuesday at the home of Mrs. Amy Trowbridge, who had cared for her during her last illness.

Mrs. Holeman had undergone major surgery at the Jackson county hospital early last September. At first her convalescence was very satisfactory. In a short time, however, she had to return to the hospital for additional surgery and since that time steadily had grown worse. Her condition had been critical for the past two weeks and she was in a coma for several hours prior to her death.

Mrs. Holeman was born in Brownstown on November 2, 1879, a daughter of the late Isaac Franklin and Susan H. Bland Clark. She had spent all of her life in this vicinity and was married on May 25, 1902, to John Logan Holeman, who died in January of 1953.

She was a member of the Brownstown Baptist Church and was known and loved for her quiet manner, her loyalty and her thoughtfulness for others.

Surviving in addition to Mrs. Okes, whom she reared from childhood, are a son, Riley Franklin Holeman, of Anderson, a daughter, Mrs. Howard Barnes, of Chicago, and two other grandchildren, Barbara and Gerald Barnes, of Chicago.

A daughter, Mrs. Glen McClintock, a grandson and a brother, Orville Clark, are deceased.

The Rev. Myron Hinton, pastor of the Brownstown Baptist Church, will read the funeral rites. Interment will be in Fairview Cemetery here.
