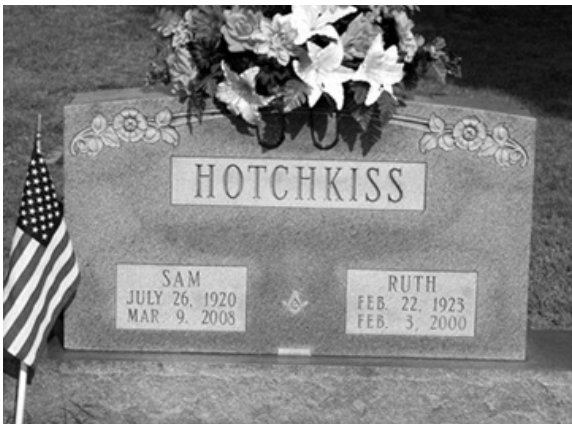

July 26, 1920 – March 9, 2008



S.M. "Sam" Hotchkiss Jr., 87, Brownstown, passed away at 9:18 a.m. Sunday, March 9, 2008, at Hoosier Christian Village, Brownstown.

Mr. Hotchkiss was a 75-year member of Brownstown Christian Church, where he served as a former elder, treasurer and trustee. He also was a former member of the church choir. He served in the U.S. Navy on the USS Bunker Hill during World War II. He was a



superintendent of Kieffer Paper Mill, retiring in 1982 after 43 years of service. He was a member of Washington Lodge 13 Free and Accepted Masons, Order of Eastern Star, American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars. He liked to fish and play golf. He was a charter member of Hickory Hills Golf Club.

Born July 26, 1920, in Brownstown, he was a son of S.M. Hotchkiss Sr. and Myrtle Jane Lockman Hotchkiss, both of whom preceded him in death. On July 6, 1941, in Vallonia, he married Ruth E. Trowbridge, who preceded him in death Feb. 3, 2000.

Survivors include two sons, David M. (Linda) Hotchkiss, Brownstown, and S.M. Hotchkiss III, Indianapolis; a daughter, Mary Beth (Stanley) Sut-

ton, Greenfield; two sisters, Virginia H.
