Russell F. "Bud" Lutes, 78, Seymour, passed away unexpectedly Friday, Dec. 14, 2012, at Highlands Regional Hospital, Sebring, Fla.

Russell was a member of Seymour First Church of the Nazarene. He had retired from Arvin Industries, where he had worked in the engineering department.

He was a U.S. Air Force veteran, discharged in January 1966. He was active for many years in the Emmaus Community, having served on 25 Walks for Emmaus and Chrysalis.
