MCCRARY—Mrs. Amanda McCrary, whose sickness has often been mentioned in these columns, died at her home at this place Thursday night, April 13, 1916, after an illness of several months, aged 60 years, 4 months and 26 days. She was first taken sick with the grip but the immediate cause of her death was cancer.

Deceased was a daughter of Mrs. Abraham Brough and was born at Salem November 17, 1855. She had been married twice. First to John E. Pfenning, of Wegan, who preceded her to the grave March 23, 1895. To their union were born two daughters, Mrs. Maude Hancock and Mrs. Daisy Clark, both of this place, who survive her. She also leaves her aged mother and one grandson, Master Roy Clark. She was again united in marriage to Charley McCrary, who preceded her to the grave September 30, 1909.

In early life she united with the Christian church but after her marriage to Mr. Pfenning she united with the old Presbyterian church, at Euchretown, now Wegan, and when the family moved to Brownstown she put her membership in the Presbyterian church at this place and remained a faithful member until death. She was also a member of the Ladies' Aid Society, the Bible class and the Missionary Society of the church. She was greatly devoted to her family and her thoughts were ever centered in the welfare of her children. She was a good, kind neighbor and will be greatly missed by them.

The funeral services, under the auspices of Lucullus Temple, No. 142, Pythian Sisters, were held at the Presbyterian church Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. W. U. Guerrant officiating, after which the remains were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
