S. McElfresh Dies Tuesday, Rites Set Friday

Sherman McElfresh, Sr., 56, Hill View Trailer Court, Brownstown, died at noon Tuesday at the Indiana University Medical Center in Indianapolis after being in ill health for five months.

A native of Jackson County, Mr. McElfresh was born May 19, 1915, to the late Quiller and Attica Barr. McElfresh. On Oct. 5, 1937, in Brownstown, he married the former Catherine Schwein, who survives.

Mr. McElfresh attended the Brownstown United Methodist Church and had been employed for five years on the Brownstown police force. He was an honorary member of the Brownstown Exchange Club and was a member of the Jackson County Pistol Club and Washington Lodge No. 13, Free and Accepted Masons, of Brownstown.
