John R. McKain Dies Friday Morning—Rites Held Sunday

Funeral services for John R. McKain, of Brownstown, who passed away Friday morning, were conducted from the Brownstown Baptist Church Sunday afternoon at two o'clock.

Officiating were the Rev. Myron Hinton, of Hope, a former pastor of the church, and the Rev. David Holt, pastor of the Tampico Baptist Church. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery.

Mr. McKain died at two o'clock Friday morning at the home of his son, Dean McKain, and Mrs. Mc-Kain, near Brownstown, after an illness of about two years.

Mr. McKain was retired in 1950 from the Lehigh Portland Cement Company at Shale Hill about three miles northeast of Brownstown. He had been a shovel operator at Shale Hill for 37 years.

Born February 7, 1883, at Brownstown, he was the son of William and Katherine Paris McKain, both deceased. He was married first to Eva Pilman and after her death, he married Bess Cockerham, who passed away Feb-

ruary 7, 1957.

One daughter and two sons from the first marriage survive, hamely, Mrs. Katherine Critchlow, Indianapolis; Richard McKain and Roscoe McKain, of Brownstown. From the second marriage two daughters and six sons survive.
