Services were conducted Thursday afternoon, Aug. 18, from the Winklepleck-Weesner Funeral Home in Brownstown for Kenneth Dean McKain, 54, of Brownstown Rt. 2.

The Rev. Myron Hinton, pastor of the Columbia City Baptist Church, officiated, and burial was in Fairview Cemetery.

Mr. McKain died at 6:40 a.m. Tuesday, Aug. 16, at the Jackson County Hospital.

Born Jan. 11, 1923, in Jackson County, he was the son of the late John R. and Evie Pilman McKain. He was a lifetime county resident.

On Aug. 20, 1945, he married Madeline Crawford, who preceded him in death in 1963. On Sept. 1, 1967, he married Eva Hatton, who survives.
