## Mrs. Dean McKain Dies—Was County Health Nurse

Mrs. Madeline F. McKain, 45, Brownstown R2, public health nurse of Jackson County, died at 2:20 a. m. Friday in Schneck Memorial Hospital where she had been a patient since Tuesday and had undergone surgery Wednesday. She was the wife of Dean McKain.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p. m. Monday from the Brownstown Baptist Church, with the Rev. Myron Hinton, former pastor, and the Rev. R. T. Wilkins, present pastor, officiating. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

Friends may call after 3 p. m. today at the Winklepleck Funeral Home, Brownstown.

Mrs. McKain was appointed public health nurse of the county on January 1, 1963. A native of Adams, Mass., she had been a resident of Jackson County since just after World War II.

She became a registered nurse after receiving nurse's training at Pittsfield, Mass., and during the War, she was a captain in the U. S. Army Nurse Corps.

While stationed overseas, she met her husband, Kenneth Dean McKain, to whom she was married on August 20, 1945, at Pilzen, Czechoslovakia.

In the Army Nurse Corps, she received her training at Camp Forrest, Tenn. Mrs. McKain was a member of the First Congregational Church at Adams, Mass.

She was born on October 2, 1917, the daughter of Melvin H. and Mary Burger Crawford, both of whom survive and reside at Adams.

Besides her husband and parents, Mrs. McKain is survived by two children, Mary Ellen McKain and Melvin Dean McKain, both at home, and one brother, James Crawford, Adams, Mass.
