Rites Held For Mrs. Z. McMahan

Funeral services for Mrs. Alice McMahan, 82, matron of the Jackson County Home for almost a quarter of a century and wife of Ziba McMahan, superintendent of the county home, were conducted this afternoon from the residence at Brownstown with the Rev. C. W. Taylor, pastor of the Brownstown Methodist Church, and the Rev. C. S. Black, retired Methodist minister of Seymour, in charge. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

Mrs. McMahan died about 3:45 o'clock Saturday afternoon at her residence at the county home following an illness of four years' duration. Death was attributed to a cerebral hemorrhage.

She had been matron of the Jackson County Home for the past 24 years and was well known throughout the county for her pleasing disposition and her kindness to those who lived at the home. She was born January 28, 1872 at Houston, the daughter of the late Richard and Kathryn Hill Pruitt and had spent her entire life in Jackson county. She was married April 5, 1896, at Houston to Ziba McMahan, who survives.

Mrs. McMahan was a member of the Brownstown Methodist Church, which she had served faithfully for many years and she was a charter member of the Women's Society of Christian Service of the church. A host of friends throughout the entire county mourns her death.

Besides the husband, she is survived by one son, Charles McMahan, of Tampa, Fla., and three daughters, Mrs. Dorothy Midkiff, of Beech Grove, Ind.; Miss Doris McMahan and Miss Maude McMahan, both at home. Two brothers, John Pruitt, of Seymour and James Pruitt, Norman R2, seven grandchildren and three great grandchildren also survive. Three children preceded her in death.
