Ernest Leon McMahan, 81, died at 4:30 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 29, 2009 at his home.

He attended Medora High School and was a member of Brownstown Christian Church. He served in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict from 1951 to 1953.
