Heart Attack Fatal To Frank McMillan, Highway Clerk

Frank Orlando McMillan, 62, Jackson County Highway clerk, who lived at 217 Asher street, in Brownstown, died suddenly from a heart attack Friday morning while at work at the county highway garage.

He was rushed by ambulance to the Jackson County Hospital but was pronounced dead on arrival.

He was born in Jackson County, December 17, 1908, a son of the late Orlando and Lou Van Cleve McMillan, and was married, in Seymour, June 16, 1946 to Elma Praggy, who survives.

He had spent all of his life in Jackson County, served with the armed forces during World War II and had been employed as a clerk at the County Highway garage for two years.

He was a member of Camp Jackson Post No. 112, American Legion, of Brownstown and of the Brownstown United Methodist Church.

Surviving, with the widow are three children, Mary, Mike and Donald McMillan, all at home.

A brother and a sister are deceased.

Funeral rites were Monday afternoon from the Winklepleck-Weesner Funeral Home here, in charge of the Rev. Staten E. Lightfoot, United Methodist pastor.

Burial was in Fairview Cemetery.
