

## DEATH RECORD.

MCNERNEY-Mrs, Dorothy Burrell McNerney, wife of Peter J. McNerney, died Thursday evening, January 3, 1907, at 6:30 o'clock, aged 36 years, 7 months and 19 days. She had been afflicted with diabetes for about two years. The best of medical skill was sought and last winter her husband took her to California with the hope that her health would be restored, but the disease gradually continued its course. However, she was able to be about most of the time and was out calling on friends a few days before d her death. Funeral services were conducted at the Presbyterian church Sunday morning at 10:30 o'clock. Rev. Weaver, pastor of the Presbyterian church, and Rev. T. W. Northcott, n T pastor of the M.
