**McOsker** — Joseph McOsker, aged 70 years, died suddenly of heart trouble at the home of his son, Harry McOsker, with whom he made his home, Friday afternoon about 12:30 o'clock. He had been suffering with heart trouble for some time. He ate a hearty dinner and had gone out in the yard. A little later his daughter-in-law sent her little son, Pat, to see if he was there. He returned in a few moments and said, "I can't find grandpa". Pat then went back into the yard and made the discovery that Mr. McOsker had expired in an out building.

Mr. McOsker was the son of John and Matilda McOsker and was born January 2, 1856, about five miles west of Brownstown, and has practically spent his entire life in Jackson county. He was married to Miss Myrtle Bowman in March, 1891. To this union were born two children, Mrs. Price Shelton of Seymour, and Harry McOsker, of Brownstown, who survive him. He also leaves one grandson, Pat McOsker, whom he idolized, two brothers and two sisters, Jerry, of Brownstown; Dan and Mrs. Elmer Kerner, of Brownstown township, and Mrs. Margaret Engle, of Detroit, Mich. His wife died suddenly October 8, 1920. Since the death of his wife he had made his home with his son.

Deceased was held in high esteem by a large circle of friends. He was of a kind and generous disposition and always ready and willing to assist anyone in need.

Funeral services were conducted at the residence Sunday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, the Rev. John M. Cross, pastor of the Christian church, officiating. Burial in Fairview cemetery.
