

Mrs. Ruth Murphy, age sixty-three, widow of the late Dr. Harry Murphy, Brownstown dentist, died Thursday afternoon at Sacred Heart Hospital, Philadelphia, Pa Death was due to complications following an illness of several months duration. Mrs. Murphy had been in Pennsylvania with her daughter, Mrs. Helen Hommel, of Wynne Wood, a Philadelphia suburb.

Mrs. Murphy was born on July 17, 1836, in Brownstown township, the daughter of Jacob W. and Eunitia Bain Branaman, both of whom preceded her in death. On March 1, 1903, she was married to Dr. Harry Murphy, who died August 3, 1937.
