

Nowling — After an illness of two years, Samuel David Nowling, age 55 years, passed away at his home south of Brownstown Thursday night at 10 o'clock. Death was due to a complication of diseases.

Funeral services, which were largely attended, were conducted at the Baptist church Sunday afternoon at 1 o'clock with the Rev. J. R. Quick, pastor, in charge, assisted by Rev. E. E. Pedicord. Burial in Fairview cemetery.

Mr. Nowling was a native of Washington county. He was the son of Andrew and Melissa Walker Nowling and was born February 13, 1886. He was married at Salem April 4, 1908, to Hattie Gaiter, who survives.

Mr. Nowling was well known. He was a millwright by occupation and for twenty-eight years was employed at the Kieffer Paper Mill at Brownstown until he was forced to retire because of illness. He was a good neighbor and a kind obliging friend.

Survivors besides the widow are eleven children: Clarence, Mrs. Edith Holeman, Marion, Nelson, Jesse, Hubert, Roberta, Dale, Jean and Vernon Nowling, all of Brownstown, and Mrs. Fairy Childers, of Cincinnati.
