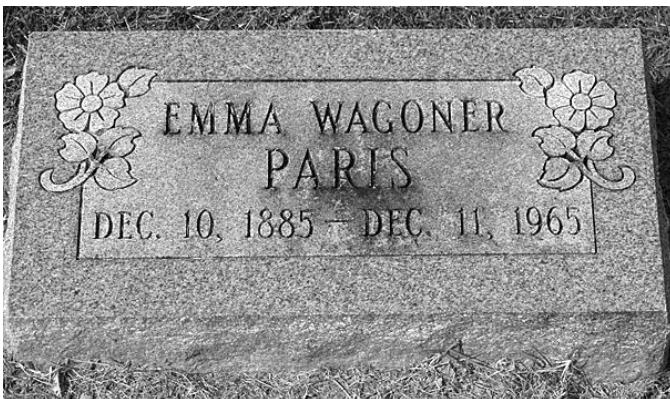

Ex-Local Resident Succumbs At Madison

Funeral services for Mrs. Emma Paris, 80, a former Seymour resident, were to be conducted this afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Winklepleck Funeral Home in Brownstown with the Rev. Evan Bolejack, minister of the Christian Church, officiating. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

Mrs. Paris died Saturday morning in a Madison hospital. She had been ill about a month.

Born Dec. 10, 1885, in Jackson County, she was the daughter of Elisha and Martha Moore Wagoner, both deceased. She spent most of her life in this area.

In 1920 she was married in Brownstown to Newton Paris, who preceded her in death.

While living in Seymour she attended the First Church of the Nazarene here.
