J. A. PERSINGER ANSWERS CALL

Indianapolis Man's Death Is
Sixth in Immediate Family
in Little Over Year.

FUNERAL RITES MONDAY

John A. Persinger, age fifty-eight, of Indianapolis, died at the family home on U. S. Road 50 three miles east of Brownstown at 1 o'clock this morning. Mr. Persinger, who had been in failing health for a year, had come to the family home some time ago for a visit when he became ill. His condition grew steadily worse until his death.

Mr. Persinger's passing was the sixth death in the immediate family in less than thirteen months. His father, Henry Persinger, died January 25, 1932; his mother, Mrs. Mary Robertson Persinger, died November 14, slightly more than a month ago; his bother-in-law, Frank Peters, passed away on December 1, 1931 and two of his nephews, Harlan Peters and William Fosbrink, were killed on September 30 of this year when the truck in which they were riding figured in a collision with another truck on new U. S. road 50 between this city and their homes. His sister, Mrs. Rosanna Peters, has suffered the loss of father, mother, husband, only son and a brother in less than thirteen months.

Mr. Persinger was born September 14, 1874, in Hamilton township and has made his home in Indianapolis during the past

twenty-two years where he was affiliated with an electro-type company. He was married May 1, 1898, at Rockford to Mary Lafkin and on December 31, 1910, at Westport to Jane Land, who survives. He was a member of the Robert Dale Methodist Episcopal Church at Indianapolis. He is well known throughout the county and many friends mourn his death. The bereaved family has received many tokens of sympathy from relatives, friends and acquaintances who feel that its members have had more than their share of sorrow in recent months.

Besides the widow, he is survived by four children, Mrs. Morton Meyer, of this city, and Mildred, John A. and Ruth, all at home at Indianapolis. One brother, James Persinger, residing on a Seymour rural route and three sisters, Mrs. Rosanna Peters, Miss Bertie Persinger and Mrs. Andrew Fosbrink, all of Jackson county, and three grandchildren also survive.

Funeral services will be conducted at 1:30 o'clock Monday afternoon from the family home on road 50 with the Rev. E. E. Pedicord, of Brownstown, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.
