John Persinger, 85, formerly of Brownstown, died at 6:30 p.m. Sunday at Hoosier Christian Village, Brownstown. He had been ill for 10 months.

A U.S. Army veteran of World War II, he was an equipment superintendent in foreign construction; an instructor of road building, bridge construction and heavy equipment operation at Southeastern Indiana Vocational School, Versailles; a diesel mechanics teacher at Camp Atterbury; and a field representative for Cummins Engine Co. He retired in 1973.

Born Oct. 31, 1908, in Washington County, he was the son of Issiah and Luella Lockhart Persinger. On July 18, 1928, he married Margaret Kathryn Boling in Bloomington. She survives.
