Two trucks, traveling in a cloud of smoke from burning straw removed from new pavement on Federal Highway No. 50, crashed a short distance east of the Deer Creek bridge about 6:30 o'clock Friday night, resulting in the death of two men and injury to three others.

The dead:

Harlan Peters, age twenty-four, manager of the Seymour bulk station of the Phillips Petroleum Corporation,

was severely crushed.

Peters was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Peters and was born in Brownstown township. His father died several months ago. He was born May 23, 1908. He was employed here for several years, having worked with another oil company before taking his present position as bulk station manager for the Phillips company. He was a popular young man and had a wide acquaintance here and in Brownstown. He leaves his mother, Mrs. Rosanna Persinger Peters, near Brownstown.

Double funeral services will be held for Peters and Fosbrink at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon at the Christian church at Brownstown. The rites will be in charge of the Rev. E. E. Pedicord, pastor of the church. Burial at Fairview Cemetery at Brownstown.
