Martin P. Pferrer Dies At Hospital Saturday

Martin P. Pferrer, 66, one of Brownstown's well known business men, died at the Jackson County Hospital, Seymour, Saturday night at 11 o'clock, where he had been confined one week. Death was due to complications. He had been in ill health for two years and was seriously ill four weeks.

Mr. Pferrer, son of the late John and Regina Kober Pferrer, was born in Driftwood township March 17, 1886. He was married in Seymour April 26, 1908, to Gertrude Stradley, who survives.

He was a director of the Citizens State Bank and the Jackson Building Loan Association of Brownstown, a charter member of the Brownstown Lions Club and the Brownstown park board. He had been retired from business ten years. He was a member of Our Ladies of Providence Catholic church and had a host of friends throughout the county.

Survivors besides the widow are two sons, Charles and Robert Pferrer, both of Brownstown; two daughters, Mrs. Eva Perkins, of Brownstown, and Mrs. Harold Knott, of Seymour; one brother, John Pferrer, of Medora; four sisters, Mrs. Van Robertson, of Brownstown; Mrs. Scott Pounds, of Brownsburg; Mrs. Therest Elstrod and Mrs. Hettie Overstreet, both of Indianapolis, and ten grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday morning at 9 o'clock at Our Lady of Providence Catholic Church with the Rev. Father John Minta, assisted by the Rev. Father Ralph Hoffman, of New Albany, in charge. Burial in Fairview cemetery.
