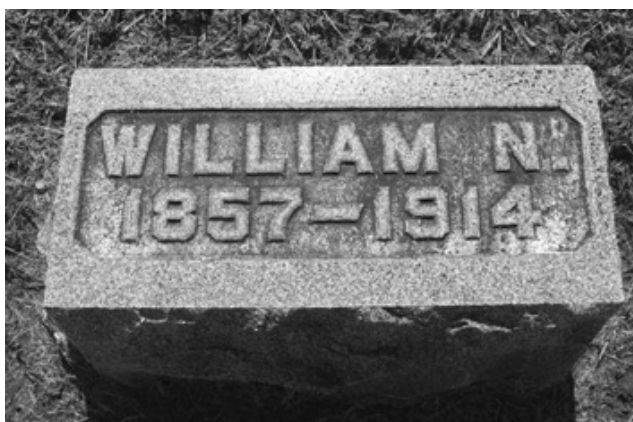

BROWNSTOWN HOTEL MAN IS SUDDENLY STRICKEN

**William Phifer, Aged Fifty-Six
Years, Succumbs to Attack of
Heart Trouble.**

William Phifer, proprietor of the Phifer Hotel at Brownstown, was stricken with heart trouble about 1 o'clock this morning and his death occurred almost instantly. Although he had suffered with this affliction at various times for several years, his condition was not regarded as serious and he enjoyed his usual health until the attack came. Shortly before midnight he went to the B. & O. Southwestern depot to meet a traveling man who arrived on the late westbound passenger train and when he returned to the hotel he remarked that he was having some difficulty in breathing regularly. He was stricken shortly after he reached the hotel.

Mr. Phifer was the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Phifer and was born in Brownstown fifty-six years ago last October. He spent his entire life in that vicinity and for several years had successfully conducted a hotel. He had a wide acquaintance throughout Brownstown township and leaves a host of friends.

The deceased is survived by one son, William, of Dublin, Indiana. He also leaves three sisters, Miss Lou, Mrs. James Clemmens and Mrs. Elizabeth Lauster, of Brownstown, and two brothers, John and J. H. Phifer, of Brownstown. He was a member of the Brownstown K. of P. Lodge.
