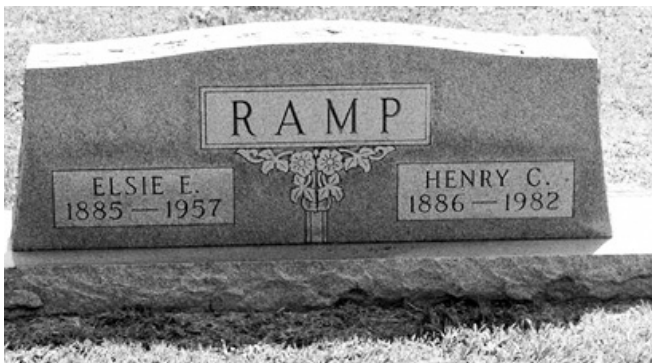

## Brownstown Resident Dies Of Heart Attack

Mrs. Elsie Ramp, 71, died suddenly of a heart attack at her home in Brownstown at 3:30 p. m. Friday, after an illness of one year.

The daughter of Samuel and Laura Tinch Braden, both deceased, Mrs. Ramp was born Nov. 10, 1885, in Jackson county. She was married in 1911, to Lockman Vincent Hall, and after his death she became the wife of Henry Ramp, on Dec. 26, 1929, at Medora.
