## J. L. Reedy Dies, Services Set Saturday

Joseph Lawrence Reedy, 65, Brownstown R1, died at 1:30 a. m. Thursday at his residence after an illness of nine months.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p. m. Saturday from the First United Methodist Church in Brownstown with the Rev. Lester Kaufman, pastor of the Honeytown Christian Church, and the Rev.
